Meet Jakob Nordengård: The Man Unveiling Climate Politics

Tom: [00:00:00] My guest today is Jakob Nordengård.

Jacob: I'm a geographer and, uh, have a PhD in science and technology studies from Linköping University in Sweden. And, uh, I have written six books now about, um, climate politics, energy, and, uh, geopolitics and, uh, Uh, one of the, uh, one of the books will be out, uh, April the 2nd called Rockefeller controlling the game.

It was, uh, initially released, uh, in 2019, but now it's, uh, coming out internationally. And uh, I have written a couple of other books as well, uh, covering, uh, more, uh, more than climate.

Tom: Okay.

The Fascinating Journey Behind 'Rockefeller Controlling the Game'

Tom: Now, as I was just saying, before I hit record, I've been reading a preview of your book about controlling the game and it's [00:01:00] freaking fantastic.

I think it's absolutely fantastic. So interesting that you've, uh, spelled out how we got to where we are. Uh, for me, I'm so interested in the climate side of it. Uh, you spell out in great detail what happened in the fifties and stuff. And, uh, I have never seen this laid out in any way like this before. So, I think, I would encourage tons of people to read it.

I think it's just excellent work. So, Congratulations. You must have put a lot of work into this. Was it years? I guess. Huh? Yes,

Jacob: it is. Um, it's actually, it's like 15 years ago. I started to work on this, uh, at, uh, uh, Linköping university as a PhD student. And, um, and I was just about to, I was supposed to write a short background chapter for my, my PhD, uh, uh, thesis that's is about, uh, European biofuels policy.

And, uh, but I, I just wanted to have five, uh, like five pages about the background [00:02:00] to the climate issue, uh, and that, but that led me into, uh, I, I, uh, I realized how important this was and, and, uh, and how, uh, it was a totally different story that I found, uh, found out about, uh, as I was doing this. So there's five pages, but,

uh, was supposed to deliver, it went to 50 pages at that time.

And, uh, yeah, so I released this as a working paper. And that's the, that's the, uh, kind of a beginning of the, of this, uh, what eventually became the Rockefeller controlling the game book. Yeah.

Unraveling the Rockefeller Influence on Climate Politics

Tom: So people from the outside, they might think, uh, at first, they don't know anything about this. Oh, this is a conspiracy theory.

This guy's making up some stuff about what he thinks is happening. But you went in and actually read real documents and real history to put this all together, right?

Jacob: Yes. Yes. Um, I [00:03:00] mean, um, I'm a, I'm a trained, uh, I mean, uh, researcher, I mean, I have a PhD. So, so it's, so I, I'm very thorough in, in, in documenting everything.

And, and, uh, so, uh, No speculation. I mean, I went into, uh, and, uh, especially because one thing, but I found out during this time I was doing this, um, working paper, it was that, uh, one foundation popped out all the time. It was like, uh, the Rockefeller Foundation, and, and that intrigued me. It was just why, why would the Rockefeller Foundation, I knew I've studied, uh, energy politics before and, uh, and, and, uh, uh, knew about the influence of the standard oil corporation and all.

Uh, I mean, what came out of it, uh, wax on. Mobile. That was, that was the other side. That was the [00:04:00] enemy of, uh, of those climate activists. So, so it was what? How could this happen? So, so one thing I did, uh, was to, uh, Actually, go back to the archives, uh, Rockefeller, uh, I mean, the Rockefeller Philanthropy has excellent archives, uh, Rockefeller, uh, archives, these, uh, they have covered all their doings since, uh, I mean, uh, All the 20th century.

So I went back and picked up, they have all their annual reports from like 1913 and also I found out another philanthropy that they have, the Rockefeller Brothers Fund, they started in 1940. So I checked all these, I downloaded all these documents just to, to check how, [00:05:00] uh, How had they been involved in climate?

How did it start? How do they, and I also read a lot of biographies as well, because I wanted to know, in their own words, what they did, what did they want to achieve? With this, why was it important and then and so on. So it's not, I have not wanted to speculate, I wanted to, to, uh, It's kind of more or less their story.

But I, uh, just bring to life and put together. Yeah. So I've been, yeah,

Tom: I've been into the climate debate for whatever, 17 years reading about this stuff all the time. And I found myself learning stuff on just about every page of this fantastic. And there's this whole thing where people on the other side, on the alarmist side, think that people like me must have big funding behind me.

[00:06:00] And that's why I'm saying what I'm saying.

The Surprising Funding Behind Climate Activism

Tom: But I can see that it's very much projection because there's all sorts of funding on the other side that, uh, like you talk about in detail, about three 50. org, we're supposed to think that three 50. org is just a bunch of plucky upstarts, whatever. But you're talking about, they're funded by Rockefeller, right?

They've had big money funding them, people earning six figure salaries for them, things like that. Yes,

Jacob: they do. Um, and uh, uh, and actually, at the Paris, uh, meeting, um, when the Paris Agreement was uh, uh, signed, they had this press conference with, um, and it was, uh, it was the Rockefeller Brothers Fund.

Together with three fifty.org. They sat there together, the, the oil Money Rockefeller bra was fun. I mean it was sad at oil, money , but they were [00:07:00] founded with. And uh, 300 fifty.org. And, uh, it was a kind of funny story because. At that time, if you remember, uh, a lot of these, uh, more influential people, they said, oh, and the activists, they said, oh, this wasn't really a good meeting.

It wasn't good enough. We haven't got that deal we really wanted. It's full of loopholes and everything. And, uh, but the Rockefeller Brothers fund, we asked, well, quite well, now we just heading into the next phase of this. So it will take some years, but, uh, so they were very satisfied because they knew a lot of this.

And they actually were involved, uh, before, uh, the Copenhagen meeting, the COP, uh, 15, I think it [00:08:00] was. Uh, and, uh, uh, After this, I mean, it was a disappointment, haha, the activists did, it was a, no, we didn't get the deal we wanted. What happened after this, it was, I mean, the Chinese weren't, that, they didn't want to, we didn't agree on this, some, some thing.

So what happened after this meeting, it was the Rockefeller Brothers Fund. They had so, uh, great contacts with China. So, so they, uh, actually did the negotiations. With China to, uh, get, uh, so, uh, they would get in line to, to strike this big deal in, in, uh, 2015.

The Globalists' Agenda and the Great Reset

Tom: So I think it's so interesting that normal people going through their lives, um, they, they think it's a conspiracy theory that there are rich folks out there that want to control all of [00:09:00] our lives, that the globalists want to control our lives.

But I think there's no way. That anybody can read through your this book of yours and conclude that there aren't rich people who are trying to control our lives I mean you you spell it out so

Jacob: well Yes. I mean, and that's one thing of getting rich. You can't, if you don't have control over things in society, you won't get rich.

You have to, to know what's happening, you have to, to influence, uh, politics, you have to influence economics, everything, uh, in order to to, to, uh, get rich and stay rich. Otherwise you will lose your, your fortune.

Tom: So to kind of jump to the end, how do you think things are going right now for people pushing the Great Reset and the globalism?

Because as I read through this all these decades, it seems like with the media the way it was back then, That they could get away with this much more easily than they can now and now we have people like you openly write about it writing about it and going on podcasts and [00:10:00] stuff and it seems like people are waking up and it's harder for the Rockefellers to get away with this stuff now than it was even five years ago.

Do you agree with any of that or what do you think?

Jacob: Yes, I think they are in a hurry Uh, to, to get things done and, uh, one of the, the, the big things, but I mean, I don't cover this in, in, in the Rockefeller book because this, it ends in, in like 2000, early 2020, uh, the story and about how the pandemic, uh, comes in and, uh, So, what's happening now is, uh, we have another process, uh, going through the United Nations system about, uh, a document called Our Common Agenda and a big meeting that will be held, uh, in September this year called Summit of the Future, and, and that's, uh, huge, and, uh, and that's what they, they want to achieve, uh, uh, something we call the pact for the future.

And in that pact, we have [00:11:00] all the packages with the climate, how to solve the climate problem, uh, forever or like, so, so they really, really want to achieve this, but this is kind of, They don't get another chance, uh, this is, uh, and people are really starting to, to know about these things. Uh, so, I mean, uh, one thing is that they have, uh, through the decades just, uh, could have had, uh, the chance to operate without a lot of people knowing about it.

But, but now it's, uh, much, much, much harder.

The Power of Information in the Digital Age

Jacob: And, uh, because information is everywhere and, uh, as, uh, and we have, uh, internet and that's, that's one thing with, uh, I don't know if you remember this with, uh, uh, the global risk report that, uh, World Economic Forum put out. It was [00:12:00] in, uh, in January at the, uh, before the big meeting in Davos and the global risk report.

They, uh, they have issued this since 2004 and, uh, often we have, we find the climate change shown on top of it and the climate change is, is a, is a big risk, they say. But the biggest risk of them all is not climate change. And then it's not, uh, I mean, you could think about like, uh, we have this war in the Middle East, we have Ukraine, Russia situation and everything.

So it's a, it's a lot of things happening. But the biggest risk they see is, uh, climate change. Disinformation and

Tom: that's the biggest risk to them, right? That is because

Jacob: it is information and we talk about malinformation as well. And that's correct information. But that can be used in a way that [00:13:00] can influence people badly for them.

It's like being caught with your hand. It's like being caught with your hand. So yeah,

Tom: so this makes me happy. So you are agreeing with me that there might be some panic internally that these people they're trying to sell us the stuff and they're seeing the way things are going. They're seeing this great awakening and they're not liking it.

They're wondering how they can quash it. Yeah,

Jacob: I mean, one thing, if you, uh, if you read my book, you can see how they have been involved in, in, in trying to, to influence and

control, uh, opposing voices, opposing movements and so on. Uh, that's, that's the way. And uh, And they have been trying to do this now as well, but it's getting, because they don't have that much, uh, the power we have.

It's just, uh, it's like the, uh, the narcissist, the psychopath that, that gaslights and, uh, and, uh, shouting out bad [00:14:00] names and, and, uh, all these things. And that, that's the kind of, you expose yourself and you're doing that. Uh, if you just, uh, uh, and, and just calling people like they are right wing extremists and, and so on.

It's, and it's, uh, and I don't think it, it work that good anymore. It, it have, might have worked before, but now it's getting harder and harder. Uh, so. So they had, they don't have any more real cards in their sleeves to deliver now. How

The Future of Internet Control and Digital IDs

Tom: big a deal do you see it as the opening up of Twitter since Musk bought it?

Uh, you know, I don't agree with everything Musk says, but I think that's absolutely huge that we're able to speak kind of freely on Twitter or more freely. What do you think? Uh,

Jacob: yeah, Musk is a, a kind of problematic, uh, uh, man. Uh, he is doing a lot of other [00:15:00] things that we, we can really question. So, so I, I don't know, um, what the thoughts about this really are about Twitter, but it, but it's, but I means of course, it's good that we actually can, uh, can, uh, come out with, with the information now.

Uh, so, uh. And, uh, because, I mean, I think it's impossible to, to stop this, it's impossible to stop ideas from getting, getting spread all over the globe now. So it's, uh, I think it's an impossible thing for them to win in the end. The only option you have in that is like, uh, making a totalitarian, uh, global government that, uh, uh, takes care of everything and, and, uh, censor you.

And eventually, I think that's, that's, [00:16:00] that's kind of a thing they want to achieve with this pact for the future because that comes with the big censorship of the internet. They more or less want to to have a united nations control over over the internet. They define it as a global commons. And who will decide over global commons?

United Nations, of course. And who controls the United Nations? So

it's a lot of things happening at that level. But one other thing is you can, you might control, try to control the internet if you get people to accept it. digital IDs and, and, and stuff. And, and if they, Uh, I mean, we could come in the future when they say you can't, uh, use internet if you don't, uh, uh, identify yourself, it will be impossible.[00:17:00]

And then, uh, all, all the things you do on, uh, the internet, I mean, it's, uh, kind of bad now. Uh, but, uh, If you have a digital ID, uh, everything, every post, everything you have done, uh, all over the years, it gets connected. Um, and then you can, with a push of a button, just okay. Delete everything. But this, uh, individual has ever posted.

It doesn't exist anymore. So, so that could be a thing, uh, with silencing in, in that, but, uh, But somehow I think it has gone so far now. It's, it's, it's getting so, uh, hard to, to push this because every, every step in this direction will get more people to, to, uh, question things. And, and, uh, so, so I, and I think that's what has happened the last years where, I mean, [00:18:00] they have one thing they are trying to do is like, uh,

this, uh, divide and conquer game. Uh, all the time when we, we have, when the pandemic came, it was a new kind of people that were, uh, I mean, the doctors and everything, and, uh, And we were war and, uh, and everything, that was another step. But we also tried to, to, uh, uh, create this opposition between, within these groups.

And, and, uh, and one, uh, one thing that is, has been huge, of course, it's, uh, now in the Middle East, because it's, uh, it's very, very sensitive. So they try to split us with this, uh, uh, things all the time. Uh, and that's, that's one of my reason, I mean, everyone's eyes is on, uh, the conflicts now, uh, Middle [00:19:00] East and, and, and, uh, Russia, Ukraine, and very few are looking on what's happening on this, uh, supranational level with the United Nations negotiations.

Hardly anyone is covering this, talking about this, uh, the news and media don't mention this at all. So, so, so that's one thing.

Exploring the Global Coup d'Etat and Future Projects

Jacob: So, um, and that's what I am trying to do now is, is, is, uh, uh, covering, I mean, I wrote all about this, the Rockefellers and the climate and, and all this, and also, uh, I've written another book about the pandemic and what's happened with that, and which will actually be out in August.

What I'm doing now is Looking into this, uh, future meeting and, uh, what they are trying to achieve with this and make, uh, other people, uh, look into it [00:20:00] as well. And because one, one thing has been that they, I mean, if you control the media, if you control CNN and, uh, all, uh, all big newspapers, uh, uh, You can just exclude these topics, but, um, but, uh, but it doesn't take that much to actually you just have to put into a few people with this information and it will, uh, starting to spread.

Like your channel, for example,

Tom: so I don't want to put, don't want to put you on the spot here, but I'm wondering if you have any plans to, um, produce some sort of an audible version of, of your book. So it's, uh, what, uh, 450 pages or so in the copy that I have, and just the way that I consume books these days, I would absolutely listen to this if you had somebody, uh, speaking it for hours, I would drive around and I would listen to it, but I'm less likely to spend the [00:21:00] time.

Actually, I just don't take the time and I should. To sit down and carefully read through the whole thing. So do you have any plans to somehow make it available as Audible? The thing is,

Jacob: um, this is, it's Skyo's publishing that has, uh, released this book now. And they have done, it will be out in, in audio. So it will be released, uh, uh, April the 2nd, tomorrow as well.

Tom: And that is fantastic news. Yeah. How actually it'll be on audible. com as a book or some other format or?

Jacob: Um, I just, the thing is, Skyhorse didn't really inform me about this, so I just went to into to the Amazon page and, and, uh, found that, uh, okay, they are doing an audio as well. So, uh, it, you will be able to purchase it, uh, on Amazon.

Tom: That is fan. That's fantastic news. I'm going to buy it for sure. That's a [00:22:00] great news. Okay. Uh, next question is, what do you think of this idea that the people trying to control us? They're playing 4 D chess and they're so smart that they are actually controlling Joe Rogan and they're controlling Robert Malone.

And, uh, those guys are controlled opposition and they're very carefully, uh, letting Joe say some stuff and not other stuff. Do you think there's anything to that? Do you believe that?

Jacob: I think, uh, I think, uh, It can be, it is like, this is a strategy as well. Yeah. You just, uh, you have to put out these rumors about people that, oh, you know, uh, that guy is controlled.

He's on the other side, so, so that, that people won't listen to, to

the, the things that they say that actually are good. So, I mean, and I think it's the best way and. If we talk about real, uh, disinformation agents like, uh, that, uh, uh, [00:23:00] intelligence services have put out, I mean, uh, it's like they have to say like 90 percent truth and then 10 percent that's untrue.

So if you know how to listen, you can actually find things and bits that are true that you can, can be useful.

Tom: Okay. Yeah, I was definitely wondering, um, how they would control Joe Rogan. And then what would he be saying if he wasn't controlled? Uh, it just seems like he's saying a lot of stuff that people, uh, the elites wouldn't want him to say.

Do you think the movie is going to have a little bit of an effect on the climate debate itself?

Jacob: Yes, yeah, yeah, but I hope it will reach other people because it's like we have this people that has been into this for a long time, interested, and those are on board with this.

We understand this. Fully. So it's, so the thing the, [00:24:00] the, the movie has to do is to be able to reach other people, but I think it, it, it will, and it's doing that because one thing with the pandemic was that, uh, we have new critical people that had never been interested in, in climate science. Uh, it was not, not, not for topics, but doctors in people's bodies, not, not in the natural world.

And so, so those people, and that, uh, was very obvious for me because, I mean, I was, have been very much into, to the climate science, the climate history and, and all these things. And, and also have a lot of, uh, Uh, contacts with, uh, uh, researchers, scientists from, from that side. Um, but then, uh, and I, I usually, I, I, this [00:25:00] Rockefeller book, I mean, it was out in Swedish in 2019.

And then first, I remember this, uh, Uh, my release, um, party and, uh, uh, it was most old men, uh, those who have been interesting, um, retired climate scientists and so on, but as, uh, been, uh, angry about how they've been treated in academia. And so they bought my book. Uh, no women were very, very few, some, some, uh, and then, uh, we had the pandemic and this started a chain reaction with a lot of other people, but that's never, never, ever thought about these things for, uh, they bought into the whole story, but, uh, when the lockdowns and every strange authoritarian things happened, they started to watch this, what is this really?

And, uh, so. A lot of new [00:26:00] people, uh, bought my, my books and then also released a book about the pandemic that was a huge success in Sweden. So it was suddenly a lot of more people and the women as well starting to, to, to be interesting and read this. So,

so, so I think, I mean, I remember the great global warming swindle when that was released.

What year was it? 2007,

Tom: I believe.

Jacob: Yeah. Yeah. Yeah. It was, yeah, it was very, very early. It was exactly the time that I started to look into, to, to climate science and became interested and skeptical. So it has had an importance for me at that time, but people kind of forgot about that. Uh, but now with this movie, it comes in, in the, uh, just about time.

And, uh, so we have a new, uh, new, uh, and also a newer generation actually, but, uh, uh, [00:27:00] haven't really known about these things. So, so I think it can have, uh, uh, an impact. On them and they, uh, and they can spread it even further to other people.

Tom: That makes me so happy to hear you relate that experience. I'm, that parallels so many other people where they're saying the, uh, the whole COVID thing, it was horrible, but so many people now are asking questions that they weren't asking questions.

I hear that over and over. And that, uh, That's such a silver lining to the whole thing. I really do think that so the great awakening is happening. And I think the Rockefeller types must not be liking this at all, which is great.

Jacob: Yes, because I mean, um, we have shot ourselves in the foot. I mean, it's, uh, when you do it too hard.

I mean, it's, it starts, uh, the opposing force gets [00:28:00] so, and you can't beat that. And it gets harder and harder to control that side of it.

Tom: They for sure overplayed their hand and I may have asked you this before, but say the climate narrative does crumble and the pandemic narrative has crumbled. What's next up?

They're not just going to give up. What's the next narrative that you see coming up?

Jacob: The UFOs.

I mean, uh, it's like, uh, I mean, that's how it has been up for, for, uh, for a long, long, long time. And, uh, And suddenly it has been, uh, tolerated to, to discuss these things and, uh, so I wouldn't be surprised at all. Um, but, but otherwise, I mean, the climate is, is such a, uh, an important thing. I mean, it's, it's, it's the backbone of the agenda.

I mean, [00:29:00] it's connected to everything and, and, um, As I mentioned in this, it's the Rockefeller Brothers Fund, they released an annual report in 2005. And they just told in this report how, what kind of subjects climate touches upon in the world. And it was kind of, they concluded, climate touches upon everything.

And therein lies our opportunity. I mean, they wrote this. So, so it's so important. I mean, if we lose this, uh, they can just, uh, next step is UFOs or being, uh, using, um, authoritarian methods that, uh, will just make, I mean, it can't succeed. It will [00:30:00] just collapse, uh, I think.

Tom: I've asked other people this question, but do you think that these people really had the dream that they were going to fool us and we're going to end up eating bugs and not flying, no private cars, live in 15 minute cities, uh, all this other stuff?

They really thought they were going to force this down our throats and the people were going to roll over and take it? That's a dream they had, right?

Jacob: Yeah, it's a dream and I think it's something, a dream that you can have if you, I mean, we talk about filter bubbles, I mean, and, uh, some of these people have been living in their own, uh, little bubble with, and, and, uh, been around other people that they are just, uh, yes, this is the way we go to, to, to create, this is the future we want and we want, we're going to create it as well.

So I think it's a. Uh, it was a kinda surprise for me, uh, to actually, [00:31:00] I mean, just as the Paris Agreement was signed the same day we agreed, uh, Klaus Schwab came out and, um, uh, uh, an article was published in Foreign Affairs about the fourth industrial revolution,

which just, uh, is just put the agenda out there. It was just. everything. Uh, and I think it's like, uh, they just assumed that I mean, we have, we have, uh, been working with this for so long. We, we, uh, um, this, this is the perfect answer to all this. And as they have just talked to each other about this, it's just like, no man, but people will just, uh, accept it because, and, and I think it's also kind of hubris because it has worked before. [00:32:00]

I mean, they actually fooled us with a lot of things before, so why wouldn't we get away with this time again? And um, and then we, they, they tried to also to, to, to influence everything and, uh, and this opposition, but they understood it would be opposition. it would. If we just take this, uh, control these opposing forces, uh, and just get the spotlight to lunatics, ordinary people will think that we are the people that are sane when, when they actually are insane.

So, so, so that was the strategy. Um, but, um, as we can see now, it doesn't work that way. And, uh, [00:33:00] and, uh, it was a kind of confusing a time and I think they became with COVID it was like a push, uh, because they wanted to, to, uh, recreate, um, the, uh, the system, uh, the international system. System. So they had to have this push and and when people were kind of scared of this, it would be easiest to put the next piece of the puzzle in.

So, so, um,

Tom: I just found some polling data actually in the last few days that backs up this idea that The elite, self described elite, live in a crazy bubble. They have no idea what real life is like. Like, there was a list of things. To fight climate change, would you favor banning each of the following? 80 percent of ivy league graduates said, yep, let's ban gas stoves.

81 percent said, ban gas powered cars. 70 percent ban non essential [00:34:00] air travel. And then, um, 68 percent of those people said let's ban private air conditioning in order to, uh, whatever, prevent bad weather. But then, they have the same polling for real people who actually live in the real world, and the support for that crazy stuff is just on the floor.

Real people don't believe in this stuff. So, yeah, I think it's a great point that they're living in this bubble and unconnected to the reality. that the rest of us live in. Very important point. Well,

The Role of Education in Propaganda and Public Opinion

Jacob: you have to be really well educated to believe in the propaganda. You know, uh, Jacques Ellul, this, uh, uh, French philosopher, uh, he wrote a book called Propaganda.

He also wrote The Technological Society, which is his most famous book. But in Propaganda, he, he, he said that Uh, we are now, uh, on the verge of developing a propaganda regime in the West that it's kind of, it, it will be more or less like the [00:35:00] same as in the communist world. Uh, but he also said that those who are most likely to, to accept propaganda, it's a well educated people.

It's the ones that are in the middle class and striving to get one step up because those people want to be a part of a discussion. They want to, to, uh, uh, they want to be a part of establishment and, uh, to have established views. It's, it's a, it's a kind of, um, I'm not one of them. I, I'm, uh, I'm actually a part of this, uh, uh, knowledge people that, that have, that have something to say in

society.

Thank you. Um, so propaganda was never about trying to reach this, uh, poor people, the losers, never interested in them. It's, you have to, to reach this. And then that's where, [00:36:00] uh, I mean, one, one thing with, uh, getting every, everyone into the education system and in, in like in Sweden, it's, uh, I mean, I remember, uh, When I was, uh, going through school and everything, I mean, it wasn't just obvious that we should, uh, go on and, uh, study at the university.

We could just take a job at a factory or something. Uh, but suddenly in, um, I think it was, I mean, I was like 25. Uh, it was Suddenly they closed down all the factories and everyone was supposed to go to the universities. And, uh, and that's when we, uh, all the insanity came into universities. So, so they wanted us to be educated or indoctrinated, uh, for, uh, for accepting, uh, the new

Tom: society.

[00:37:00] So you mentioned that you have to be educated to believe in this climate scam stuff, for example, and Richard Lindzen had a great related quote. He said, ordinary people see through man made climate fears, but educated people are very vulnerable. I think that hits the nail right on the head. I think it's way easier to sell it to people who have, you know, Education.

Yeah. Um, another question is, do you think it's just a natural state of affairs in, uh, for humans that there's a small group of people who see themselves as elite and they seize the money and the wealth because the little people are too stupid to, uh, make their own decisions? Do you think what they're trying to do right now, it's the same thing that happened in medieval times or similar type of idea, do you think?

Jacob: Yeah, I think, uh, I think, I mean, we just have another type of technology now, but we have the same people. We have the same kind of people and we have, uh, uh, it's, it's, we have a few click that is striving for power and, and, and, uh, and, uh, fortune. [00:38:00] And we have all this had, so, so it's nothing new. And, um, it's like they are trying with, uh, with the new technology they have had wanted to achieve, uh, uh, like a new feudal system, techno feudalism.

So it's, uh, yeah, but it's nothing new.

Tom: It probably is an important point there too that people are the same. I just heard someone else say that if you took a, like a caveman baby from 30, 000 years ago and dropped them into a modern household at the age of one day, that that kid would, would grow up and just be like a normal, um, or it would, uh, you would not be able to just distinguish that kid.

from someone who was born, uh, normally at this time. Do you think people are kind of the same as they were tens of thousands of years ago? Yeah.

Jacob: Yeah, yeah. I don't think we have changed that. And, and, uh, I mean, we have a lot of studies about that. I mean, it, it takes a lot, long [00:39:00] time to, to change a species.

If you don't do it on, uh, with transhumanism and all these ideas that

Tom: they have. Okay, any other points you'd like to make? This has been fantastic so far, but anything else you'd like to say? Uh,

Jacob: I don't know what I haven't, haven't said, but it's also a lot of things that is, uh, what is happening and so on.

And I think, I mean, uh, what I'm doing now, I'm, I'm, I'm actually, as I said, uh, Rockefeller book will be out tomorrow. And then they have this, uh, It's, uh, this other book, uh, that's possible to pre order now as well from Skyhorse. It's, uh, called, uh, this is the Swedish, uh, Globala Statsgruppen, or it's the Global Coup d'Etat in, uh, in English and, uh, Skyhorse will release it, uh, August the 6th. [00:40:00]

And then I also have, uh, two other books that I, uh, one about, uh, called the Digital World Brain, and that's, uh, that's about the system, uh, that They eventually want to create, but they want to, to come out of this, all these crises that we have been a part of, uh, for the last couple of decades. So that's the grand solution.

And so, so that the detailed World Brain is about, uh, United Nations and, and, uh, uh, the reform work, uh, that they are, they are, uh, working with at the moment. And, uh, they want to conclude with the summit of the future in, in September. And then I have a, uh, actually new product as well that I'm working on because all these books are written now.

So now I'm, um, uh, uh, I have a book called the temple of Solomon. Uh, that's, and that's look into [00:41:00] more of them. Occult idea, ideas that are into this agenda because I have always seen that we have had,

it wasn't just about the climate. It was very obvious for me when I, uh, when I made my PhD. It was some of these people that are involved in very, um, big influential think tanks. Uh, they had, uh, occult leanings. They had, uh, occult ideas, uh, that they put into this, uh, about, uh, how a future, uh, society would evolve.

I mentioned some of this in in the Rockefeller book, for example,

Pieta, the Chardin and Oliver Reiser and their utopian world society that they had wanted to, to, uh, to achieve. So the [00:42:00] Temple of Solomon book looks into this and, and also, uh, and the title comes from actually this professor, Oliver Rice, but he said, uh, he wrote a book about how can we create a new Temple of Solomon.

So, so that's, I'm working with this and, uh, hope to be finished, uh, late this year

Tom: with that. I'm just curious, have you had any connections or conversations with a guy named Dave Colum, the Cornell professor? He's on a lot of podcasts. I think I would love to hear you two discuss some of this stuff. I think that would be great.

Yeah. Okay. Yeah. Yeah.

Jacob: I have to check him out. I, I, I hadn't really, I don't think I've heard his name before. Okay.

Tom: And then one, one other question is, uh, you started out publishing, I guess, just in Swedish and now more in English. Uh, any other languages coming? I'd love to see, uh, lots more people reading your stuff and listening.

Jacob: Yeah, the, [00:43:00] the Rockefeller book actually, it, it, uh, the first first of a language it was, uh, translated to, was, uh, Polish. So, uh, it came out in, in, in, uh, PO Poland, uh, I think like three years ago. And it was a huge success in Poland. It sold a lot and, uh. So I think that, uh, when my book, the most, uh, watched clip with my book mentioned is from Poland.

I think it was like 6 million or something. It was just what I had no idea. Uh, but suddenly I got a kind of royalties from Poland. Okay. Um, and then, and then in Poland, uh, they have also released this, uh, global code at all. And, uh, also in France. The Rockefeller book actually was released in September last year [00:44:00] and I, and now, uh, now it will go, it goes through my, my, uh, uh, publishing house in, in USA, uh, Skyhorse.

So that's, uh, if someone wants to, to release my books, it's goes from Skyhorse nowadays. Okay.

Tom: Excellent. I'm so, so glad to hear all of this.
